- Student-centred approach in teaching;
- Open-minded and a life-learner;
- Excellent organisational and time management skills;
- High sense of responsibility & flexibility;
- Adaptable and flexible to the requirements of the school;
- There are additional opportunities to take on a responsibility; subject to experience and qualifications.

Responsibilities

- To plan additional individual or group language lessons to MYP kids (age 10-16), in accordance with the required language support, and as guided by the Head of Inclusion.
- To deliver and assess additional language learning for students, either on an individual basis, or within group situations;
- To support all teachers in managing students' conduct by promoting positive behaviour;
- To collaborate with teachers with respect to the additional language learning needs of any students:
- To actively implement adaptive teaching learning methodologies;
- To evaluate and record student progress;
- To participate in school activities & events;
- To supervise students during rest breaks and at determined periods before/after school;
- To actively attend and participate in all staff meetings and In School Coaching.
