I am delighted to announce that our school has been accepted to become members, and accredited by a well respected and highly effective international accreditation body. The New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC) partners with schools to co-create the future of education through purposeful accreditation focused on high-quality learning for all students. Focusing on prekindergarten (Nursery) through grade 12 (Year 13) they provide a relevant, future forward framework for meaningful, ongoing whole school improvement through accreditation, professional assistance, and pursuit of best practices. Founded in 1885, NEASC has a long tradition and proven reputation for quality assurance in education.

NEW ENGLAND ASSOCIATION OF SCHOOLS AND COLLEGES

The organisation has agreed to fast track our accreditation, based on the excellent work we did with the Council of International Schools (CIS) - our previous accreditation authority. We will be having an initial accreditation visit in late February, and become fully accredited by April 2026.

With such an accreditation, we will be able to offer our own High School Graduating Diplomas from September 2026 onwards. This, along with the introduction of the AP (Advanced Placement) examinations and programme, will form the basis of the children's graduating certification; once again, permitting them into universities world wide.
